2-1-1 Information and Referral of East Tennessee

2-1-1

Provides free, confidential, multilingual information and referral services that connect people to a full range of community, social, health, and government services, disaster response and relief services in times of disaster, and volunteer opportunities.

ALPS Adult Day Services

423-587-9149

Provides day health programs and supportive services for adults unable to be alone during the day including those with cognitive impairment (80%) and physical impairment such as stroke, heart problems, and developmental disabilities (20%). Support, counseling, education, respite for caregivers, and community education are available.

Appalachian Outreach

865-475-5611

Coordinates a home repair ministry, assists families with heating related crises, provides food baskets, and supplies clothing, household items, and furniture.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Duplein Valley

Goals are to inspire and enable all young people, especially those from disadvantaged circumstances, to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens. The club offers programs such as art education, career development, character and leadership, health and life skills and sports, fitness, and recreation programs.

Provides transportation assistance to help patients get to and from dialysis.

Habitat for Humanity-Jefferson County

Agency's purpose is to create simple, decent, and affordable housing for low-income families who currently have inadequate housing.

Helen Ross McNabb Center

Parent Place

Provides quality supervised, non-custodial visitation services for families going through divorce and for estranged parents. It is the only supervised visitation facility for children & non-custodial parents. Provides mandatory "Parenting Education Seminar".

Sexual Assault Center of East Tennessee

Provides victims with critical services & community awareness programs about sexual violence. Provides crisis intervention, referrals to community agencies & education on legal processes and victim rights.

Jefferson County Rescue Squad

865-397-3973

Organized by volunteers and provides emergency rescue services. Operates 24 hours, 7 days per week.

Jefferson County Senior Citizens, Inc.

865-397-3197

Operates five centers in Jefferson County: White Pine, Dandridge, Jefferson City, New Market, and Strawberry Plains aimed at supporting seniors. Services include: recreation, health screenings and health education programs, nutritional information, exercise, transportation, and social interaction.

Jefferson Rural Clinic

865-471-5525

The Jefferson Rural Clinic is a medical and dental clinic serving the uninsured populations of Jefferson, Grainger and Cocke counties. While patient donations are encouraged, there is no charge for the services provided. The clinic is run by a group of volunteers supplemented by one part-time Registered Nurse. The clinic is solely funded by donations from local individuals and organizations.

Legal Aid of East Tennessee

Provides legal assistance and advocacy for low-income and at risk individuals, families and groups.

Ministerial Association Temporary Shelter

Provides shelter, food, clothing, counseling, case management, job and home search assistance for homeless individual men, individual women and whole families and helps them to overcome obstacles to a more secure life.

Safe Harbor Child Advocacy Center, Inc.

865-774-1777

Provides safe, child-friendly environment to victims of severe neglect, physical or sexual abuse, or who have been a witness to a violent crime. Also provides in-school prevention education and provides non-offending caregiver support programs.

Safespace

Programs available for victims of domestic violence including temporary shelter, 24-hour toll-free crisis line, information and referral, advocacy, counseling, support groups, transportation, assistance with legal options, and court accompaniment.

Samaritan House

Provides shelter for homeless families. Samaritan House also makes available counseling, budgeting training, educational services, and job training.

Senior Citizens Home Assistance Service

Provides homemaker services for elderly and disabled persons, including light housekeeping, laundry, grocery shopping, meal preparation, help with personal care and companionship.
